AUDITS

MARCH 2022

Audit performs performance, operational fiscal and compliance audits with the objective of preventing fraud, waste, and abuse in Parish government. Recommendations are made to strengthen internal controls over fiscal or compliance functions, or to improve the economy and efficiency of operations. There are currently two (2) audits in process (one (1) of which is expected to be issued in April 2022). There are currently three (3) follow-up audits in process, one (1) of which was issued publicly in March 2022 and two (2) of which are expected to be issued in April 2022.



March opened with five (5) open intakes and had one (1) additional intake added. There were two (2) intake closures.




Intakes & Preliminary Reviews

Investigations is tasked with assessing incoming tips, complaints, and information. This process involves documenting the information received and conducting a limited preliminary review to consider allegations, jurisdiction, the ability to corroborate and build upon the information, as well as the potential for referral to other authorities. Generally, preliminary reviews are completed within 45 days. Please note that as of March, one (1) intake is now an evaluation and is no longer considered in the status below.



Investigative Cases

Some preliminary reviews are accepted for full investigation, thereafter referred to as a case. Cases vary in complexity and duration. Additionally, the JPOIG may work cases in cooperation with other oversight or enforcement agencies. Please note that as of March, one (1) case is now an evaluation and is no longer considered in the status below.



INSPECTIONS, EVALUATIONS, & REVIEWS

MARCH 2022

As mentioned in earlier monthly reports, the JPOIG has formalized the framework for the implementation of an Inspections, Evaluations, and Review function. The purpose will be to inspect, evaluate and review Parish government programs and procurement actions through in-depth analysis.

The process has included the development of a new chapter in the Manual of Policies and Procedures, adopting the quality standards established by the Association of Inspectors General for inspections, evaluations, and reviews. These policies and procedures address planning, conducting, and documenting inspections, evaluations, and reviews, as well as, gathering and preserving supporting materials and the reporting of results and conclusions.

The office has developed a planning package and report template for our first engagements under these standards.

MONITORING BP SETTLEMENT FUNDS

MARCH 2022

On August 24, 2015, the JPOIG recommended the \$53.1 BP settlement funds allocated to Jefferson Parish after the Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill be handled within the Parish's financial system in a manner that fully supports and facilitates transparency. To that end, the request was made for a specific project number and specific revenue account number be created exclusively for BP Settlement Funds. The JPOIG has since then tracked these funds on a monthly basis. For more information, check out our website at jpoig.wordpress.com.

These funds are unique and have a lot of nuances. In 2022, JPOIG Audits also began an audit of BP funds (including expenditures and transactions) 2019 to 2021.





The JPOIG attended Parish Council meeting on 3/23/2022. The Parish Council amended procurement ordinances in response to supply chain concerns, which included raising the threshold for bids from \$5000 to \$10,000 "to allow the Purchasing Department to react more quickly in making acquisitions of the commodities that are being affected by the supply chain disruptions."
